

Did you know?

- St. Catherine Labouré Parish, founded in 1953 is staffed by Vincentian priests. Our community includes over 2,000 households and operates one of the Archdiocese's largest K–8 schools, serving nearly 500 students..
- Our School offers two homerooms per grade from K–8, with teachers' aides in Kindergarten through 4th grade.
- We engage students through Catechesis of the Good Shepherd from Kindergarten through 5th grade.
- Our campus facilities include a STREAM room, Art and Music room, Technology Center/Library, large gymnasium, outdoor classroom, Atrium, cafeteria, Rosary Walk and Mary's Prayer Garden, Parish Hall with a stage, vegetable garden, and a large playground and field area.
- A full-time nurse, counselor, and youth minister support the whole child beyond academics.
- Part-time and full-time Learning Consultants—including a reading specialist—serve students across the academic spectrum.
- Middle School offers a two-tiered math program with standard and honors classes with smaller class sizes.
- We are a 1-to-1 device school (iPads in K–1, Chromebooks in 2–8) with a Technology Center.
- All students take the NWEA MAP Growth assessment, with K-2 also completing the NWEA Reading Fluency test.

Responsibilities

- Works closely with the assistant principal to lead the school in promoting Catholic values, aligning the school's operations with the Church's mission.
- Oversee the development, implementation, and assessment of a rigorous, faith-based academic curriculum for K-8 students.
- Supervise, evaluate, and support faculty and staff, providing professional development and guidance in both teaching and spiritual formation.
- Collaborate with the Pastor, school board, and parish leadership to support the school's vision and growth.
- Ensure compliance with school policies, regulations, and Catholic teachings.
- Foster a culture of faith and prayer, prioritizing students' spiritual growth, and leading religious activities such as Masses and prayer services.
- Promote student leadership, character development, and social-emotional growth.
- Address behavioral and disciplinary issues with fairness and consistency, in alignment with Catholic principles.
