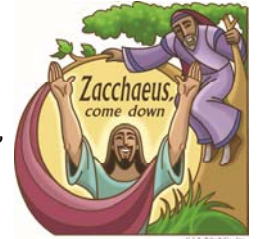

a compassionate god

Today's reading from the book of Wisdom presents an image of a patient God who "rebuke[s] offenders little by little" (Wisdom 12:2), an image endorsed by the psalmist, singing of how the LORD is "slow to anger and of great kindness, and compassionate toward all his works" (Psalm 145:8, 9). The crowd with Jesus, however, grumbles when they see Jesus's kindness and compassion extended to Zacchaeus, who was not just a tax collector, but the "chief tax collector"—a title that surely emphasizes his standing as a sinner to be scorned. In the second reading, Saint Paul urges the Thessalonians to be "worthy" of God's calling, so that "the name of our Lord Jesus may be glorified in you" (2 Thessalonians 1:12); such people, unlike the crowd in the Gospel, would rejoice at Zacchaeus's determination to change his life after encountering Jesus. ROSARY COLLECTION

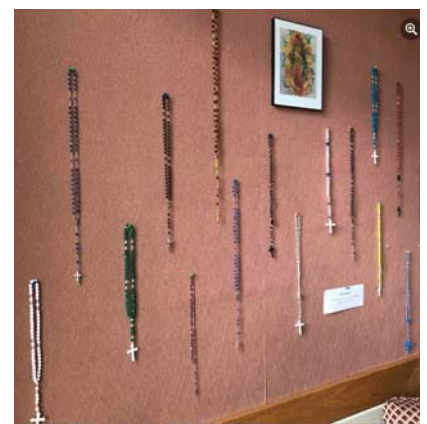
St. Catherine is collecting rosaries for a Rosary Wall at Marianist Retreat Center. Some items will remain here at St. Catherine for various ministries and organizations.

As we end this Respect Life Month of October, here are a few considerations about abortion:

Many people immediately assume that abortion **MUST** be available for the horrific circumstances of rape and incest. But both the *value of the human person and practical experience* show otherwise.

The innate worth and dignity of the human person does **not** depend on the circumstances of his or her conception.

What abortion does very effectively is **cover up the crime**. Instead of exposing the rape or incest, it allows the perpetrator to continue his secret behavior.

As horrible as it would be for a pre-teen girl to carry a child of rape or incest, it is even worse to subject her to an abortion. The abortion is **another violation** of her body, soul and mind; it is fighting violence with violence and involving her in a crime.

Rape or incest followed by abortion can utterly destroy the young girl's innocence.

Planned Parenthood routinely **fails to comply with mandatory reporting** of child sexual abuse and statutory rape. This has often allowed men engaged in sex-trafficking to continue.

Regarding the necessity of abortion to save **the life of the mother**, with modern medicine the chances that continuing a pregnancy to term would kill the mother are extraordinarily rare. However, in those cases where that possibility might exist, the crucial issue is **intent**.

If a car wreck has trapped two passengers so that saving one might take the life of the other, emergency personnel would never intentionally kill one person to get the other out. Instead, they would do everything possible to save both. If in that process one loses his or her life, that would be unfortunate but unavoidable.

Likewise, in the rare case when a pregnancy threatens the life of the mother, the physician should do everything possible to save both mother and baby. If in that effort the child dies, that is an unavoidable outcome.

ONLINE GIVING PLATFORM INSTRUCTIONS:

At the end of 2020 our Online Giving provider implemented a new platform. Everything rolled over from the previous site and no changes were required of you, but the site now looks and acts a little different. You can access the new Online Giving site directly by going to: <https://www.osvhub.com/sclparish/funds> or by accessing the site through St. Catherine Laboure's website, www.sclparish.org, then clicking on the Online Giving Box with the green medallion and cross picture in it. This will bring you to the main screen with the Online Giving Funds listed.

If you do not wish to create an account and want to just make a quick-give gift, you can click on the "Give Now" button underneath the name of the fund you wish to donate to. A new screen will appear in order to configure the gift. After you enter the gift amount, gift type and date, you will click on continue. **IMPORTANT:** The default gift type is "recurring", so if you only want a one-time gift, click on the drop down arrow next to the word recurring and select one-time. A new screen will appear requesting your personal and payment information. At the bottom of the screen, you can "Create an Account" or "Give Gift as a Guest".

If you are already an Online Giving User, you will click on "Sign In/Create an Account" in the purple bar on the top right hand side of the screen. This will take you to the login screen where you can enter your email address and password. UserID's are no longer used; they have been replaced with your email address. If you have forgotten your password, click on the link "Forgot Password" and enter your email address. Instructions will be sent to you to reset your password. Once you log into your account, your upcoming gifts and transaction history will appear. If you wish to change an upcoming gift, click on the three dots next to the dollar amount. You will have the option to "edit", "pause gift" or "cancel gift". Follow the prompts to complete any of these tasks. The system is user friendly.
