
LEAF CLEANUP

THANKSGIVING FOOD COLLECTION


Please return the filled Meal-A-Month bags next weekend, November 19/20 for the annual Thanksgiving Food Collection. We are asking for:

As we prepare for next Sunday's feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, we hear descriptions of dire and catastrophic events. Sometimes it seems as though we ourselves are living in the end times, when life as we currently know it will cease for everyone. In answer to what must have been a fearful question, Jesus does not sugarcoat his foretelling of future days. Nor does the Old Testament prophet Malachi flinch from his pronouncements upon an evil world. Saint Paul, still writing to the Thessalonians, warns them prophetically against succumbing to "The End Is Near" syndrome—indolence in the face of the final days. However, both Jesus and Malachi speak of the recompense for living a just life—healing and vindication. Our Psalm 98, typically associated with Christmastime, helps us to rejoice for the King who is coming to rule with justice.



BLACKS IN CATHOLIC HISTORY

MOMENTS

DID YOU KNOW...?

... The National Black Catholic Clergy Caucus (NBCCC) of the United States voted on Tuesday, July 24, 1990 while meeting in convention at Fordham University in New York, to establish November as **BLACK CATHOLIC HISTORY MONTH**. The reason behind the selection of the month of November was the number of important dates to Catholics of African descent that fell within this month.

- **Nov. 1 All Saints Day.** This is an opportunity to review the lives of the hundreds of Saints of African descent in the first 300 years of the Church.
- **Nov. 2 All Souls Day.** This is a time to remember all those African souls lost to cruel treatment in the Middle Passage crossing of the Atlantic Ocean.
- **Nov. 3 Feast of Saint Martín de Porres.** Saint Martin is the only saint of African descent from the Western Hemisphere.
- **Nov. 13 The birth of Saint Augustine** in 354 A.D. He is the first Doctor of the Church from North Africa.
- **Nov. 20 The death of Zumbi of Palmares in Brazil.** A South American, founder of a free state for Blacks.

The first celebration of **Black Catholic History Month** began in November of 1990 in various cities in the United States with the celebration of St. Martin de Porres Feast day. The liturgy celebrated the 350th anniversary of St. Martin's transition from this life to eternal life.

The Fundamental Issue

The Church addresses a multitude of issues, and we are to be committed to a consistent ethic of life. Numerically, abortion is one issue; but it is one issue like the foundation of a house is one part of the house. There is a hierarchy of moral values, and according to many documents of the Church, the dignity of life is fundamental. The reason why every other issue is an issue to begin with is that human beings have a right to life. The "Seamless Garment," the "Consistent Ethic of Life from Womb to Tomb"

The late Cardinal Joseph Bernardin is often invoked for his firm articulation of the consistent ethic of life, a "seamless garment." You may have heard his seamless garment ethic quoted by people who wish to justify their own silence and inaction on abortion. They say that abortion is "just one of many social ills."

But Cardinal Bernardin never intended that attitude. He issued a statement "Deciding for Life" in 1989 in which he said, "Not all values, however, are of equal weight. Some are more fundamental than others. On this Respect Life Sunday, I wish to emphasize that ***no earthly value is more fundamental than human life itself.*** Human life is the condition for enjoying freedom and all other values. Consequently, if one must choose between protecting or serving lesser human values that depend upon life for their existence and life itself, human life must take precedence." "Deciding for Life" Message for Respect Life Sunday, Cardinal Joseph Bernardin, Archbishop of Chicago, October 01, 1989

Therefore, the seamless garment is an excellent metaphor for the Church's coherent moral vision. At the same time, "It is imperative that those who are called to serve the least among us give urgent attention and priority to this issue of justice." 

ONLINE GIVING PLATFORM INSTRUCTIONS:

At the end of 2020 our Online Giving provider implemented a new platform. Everything rolled over from the previous site and no changes were required of you, but the site now looks and acts a little different. You can access the new Online Giving site directly by going to: <https://www.osvhub.com/sclparish/funds> or by accessing the site through St. Catherine Laboure's website, www.sclparish.org, then clicking on the Online Giving Box with the green medallion and cross picture in it. This will bring you to the main screen with the Online Giving Funds listed.

If you do not wish to create an account and want to just make a quick-give gift, you can click on the "Give Now" button underneath the name of the fund you wish to donate to. A new screen will appear in order to configure the gift. After you enter the gift amount, gift type and date, you will click on continue. **IMPORTANT:** The default gift type is "recurring", so if you only want a one-time gift, click on the drop down arrow next to the word recurring and select one-time. A new screen will appear requesting your personal and payment information. At the bottom of the screen, you can "Create an Account" or "Give Gift as a Guest".

If you are already an Online Giving User, you will click on "Sign In/Create an Account" in the purple bar on the top right hand side of the screen. This will take you to the login screen where you can enter your email address and password. UserID's are no longer used; they have been replaced with your email address. If you have forgotten your password, click on the link "Forgot Password" and enter your email address. Instructions will be sent to you to reset your password. Once you log into your account, your upcoming gifts and transaction history will appear. If you wish to change an upcoming gift, click on the three dots next to the dollar amount. You will have the option to "edit", "pause gift" or "cancel gift". Follow the prompts to complete any of these tasks. The system is user friendly.
