Prophets

We reflect upon the voice of the prophet in this Sunday's readings. We hear of the suffering and the rescue of Jeremiah. We hear how Jesus anticipates his suffering and death. As with Jeremiah and Jesus, the prophets were sent by God to the leaders and people of Israel. A prophet is one who speaks truth to the powerful, exposing their darker hidden motives and injustices. The prophet presents a way forward that aligns with God's purposes. A prophet can force people away from a comfortable neutrality or indifference. The prophet creates an urgency to make a choice: Are we content with the status quo, or are we to change our ways and pursue a new and better path? Today, we may also ask, how do we identify and respond to prophets of our time? How might we provide a prophetic voice in our Church and in our world?



Liturgy of the Word for Children (LWC)

The parish would like to begin Liturgy of the Word for Children at the 10:30 Mass beginning in September. We are looking for teachers for the children grades 1-4.

LWC is an extension of the main assembly celebration. It draws children into the liturgy at their own level enabling them to participate and understand what is proclaimed in the celebrations. In church (before the first reading) the children and teachers will be dismissed to a separate room. The teachers will proclaim from the children's lectionary, discuss the message with the children and apply it to their everyday life. The children will say the creed and share their petitions. They will then return to their families. Two teachers will be scheduled on a Sunday. Volunteers will need to be in compliance with the safe environment program through the archdiocese.

ARCHBISHOP | We can grieve change, but we can't suspend life It's time to invest in a new way of carrying out our mission



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The All Things New pastoral planning process is going to bring historic change to the Archdiocese of St. Louis. As we start to look at potential plans for parish and school restructuring I'd like to reflect on change — because change is hard!

There are a lot of theological things that might be said about change: how the Ascension or the conversion of Gentiles changed things for the early Church; how the gradual codification of the seven sacraments across several centuries or the creation of the seminary system after the Reformation changed things for the Church.

But maybe the most helpful perspective on change comes from the experience of parents.

With each stage of a child's growth — in the womb, infant, toddler, adolescent, teenager, young adult — parents constantly need to discover new ways of parenting.

With every transition, the temptation is to stay stuck in the previous mode of parenting. It's tempting for parents to keep the child suspended — in their imagination — in some earlier phase of life and to fail to make the transition that growth requires. But we all know what happens when parents continue to treat their teenagers as toddlers or their young adults as teenagers!

Naturally, with every transition, there's grieving. That's legitimate. Something good happens in each stage of a child's growth, and something is lost when the next phase comes. But parents can't hold on to the earlier phases, no matter how golden they may have been while they lasted. Successful parenting requires accepting the changes, then investing time and energy in learning new ways of carrying out their mission.

The experience of parents contains important lessons for us as we face our own changes in the coming years. The footprint of the archdiocese — in terms of parishes and schools — is about to change. We can and should grieve that change. Good things happened and some of them will be lost. But we can't suspend the life of the archdiocese — in our imagination, and our way of operating — at a previous "golden age." Like parents, we need to recognize the change that's happened and invest our time and energy in a new way of carrying out our mission.

When Jesus ascended into heaven the disciples remained, for a time, gazing upward, locked in an old way of relating to his body. Then two angels said to them: "Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky?" The disciples needed to be spurred into the next phase of the Church's life. They needed to go back to Jerusalem, to prepare to be anointed by the Holy Spirit and to enter into a new relationship with Jesus and the world. We stand in a similar position today.

We can and should celebrate all we've accomplished in the previous decades, even the previous 200 years. Great things have happened in the Archdiocese of St. Louis!

But we can't simply keep gazing at those great things, expecting some previous mode of the Church's life to continue. Change has come upon us, whether we want it to or not. It's time for us to go to the upper room, to pray for a new anointing by the Holy Spirit, and to enter into a new way of carrying out the mission of being Jesus' Church.

Eleven participants in the Summer Faith and Racial Healing session send you this letter in appreciation for SCL's support of JustFaith's racial justice programs. Over 110 people have participated in previous sessions at SCL. Faith and Racial Healing is the second segment in a three part group of sessions on racial justice from JustFaith.

Dear St. Catherine Laboure Parish,

We write this letter to you to thank you for supporting JustFaith's Faith and Racial Healing program this past summer. We thank you for giving us the time to slowly and purposely walk this road to consider what to say and what to do to combat racism.

We thank Sister Carol, Ezra, and Natasha, for visiting us from East Side Heart and Home. We learned that East St. Louis is a place of growth with many faith-filled citizens and families, and it should not be defined by negative images presented by the media, or by racist opinions handed down through generations. The East Side Heart and Home Family Center is a beacon of hope for the community.

Thanks to St. Alphonsus Liguori "Rock" Church who greeted us with hospitality at their Mass last weekend. Their Catholic worship celebrated their patron saint with such joy and love for Jesus through song, clapping, readings, and words.

Our nine weeks participating in Faith and Racial Healing were well-spent. Race conversations are difficult to discuss even with our closest confidants and can often feel lonely and hopeless. Knowing we are not alone on this healing journey makes it easier. We cherish the opportunity to have these conversations in a faith-filled space. Some of us will take this program to other parishes in the Archdiocese.

We urge parishioners, all Catholics and others who have the time to open their hearts to this work at St. Catherine Laboure Parish.

Attached are the results of the All Things New Education Survey. The Educational Survey included questions for a variety of audiences including: school parents, alumni/volunteer/donors, school faculty and staff, PSR parents, and PSR catechists.

School Administrators and Catechetical Leaders were asked to promote the survey to their entire parish/school communities through their school and religious education communications, newsletters, and social media and website posts. Pastors were asked to encourage parishioners to participate in the survey through pulpit announcements, bulletin announcements, website posts, email communications, and social media communication. These methods of communication were utilized to ensure the greatest response rating possible.

The Education Survey was completed anonymously and did not require specification of any individual school or parish; therefore results are not specific to any school or religious education program. The results are overarching themes across the Archdiocese identified by survey respondents.






In total, the All Things New Education Survey received **18,653** responses from all parish/school community members throughout fifteen regions of the St. Louis Archdiocese.



**Archdiocesan Funds**

Friends for Life – Young Friends for Life is a prolific group formed by the Archdiocesan Respect Life Apostolate. Its mission is to promote the dignity of human life to and through the community of Catholic young adults in St. Louis. The target audience of Young Friends for Life is young adults between the ages of 22 and 35 or so, who do not remember the landmark Supreme Court decisions of 1973 firsthand, but who live in a society that is suffering the consequences. Young Friends for Life meets quarterly and intends to host one or two high-energy, low-time commitment events a year to raise awareness about timely issues and raise money to fund other prolife activities in the Archdiocese of St. Louis.

Latin America Apostolate – Since 1956, the Archdiocese of Saint Louis has sent its own priests of the Archdiocese as missionaries to La Paz, Bolivia in South America. Due to the shortage of native priests in the Archdiocese of La Paz, Archbishop Abel Antezana requested that Archbishop Joseph Ritter send priests from Saint Louis to serve in La Paz. Archbishop Ritter said that the decision to send priests of the Archdiocese of Saint Louis as foreign missionaries was the most important decision in his twenty-three years as a bishop. This has been a special blessing for the priests, as well as for other missionaries, whether the Sisters of the Most Precious Blood in O'Fallon, Missouri, or the Papal Volunteers in Latin America (PAVLA).



ONLINE GIVING PLATFORM INSTRUCTIONS:

At the end of 2020 our Online Giving provider implemented a new platform. Everything rolled over from the previous site and no changes were required of you, but the site now looks and acts a little different. You can access the new Online Giving site directly by going to: <https://www.osvhub.com/sclparish/funds> or by accessing the site through St. Catherine Laboure's website, www.sclparish.org, then clicking on the Online Giving Box with the green medallion and cross picture in it. This will bring you to the main screen with the Online Giving Funds listed.

If you do not wish to create an account and want to just make a quick-give gift, you can click on the "Give Now" button underneath the name of the fund you wish to donate to. A new screen will appear in order to configure the gift. After you enter the gift amount, gift type and date, you will click on continue. **IMPORTANT:** The default gift type is "recurring", so if you only want a one-time gift, click on the drop down arrow next to the word recurring and select one-time. A new screen will appear requesting your personal and payment information. At the bottom of the screen, you can "Create an Account" or "Give Gift as a Guest".

If you are already an Online Giving User, you will click on "Sign In/Create an Account" in the purple bar on the top right hand side of the screen. This will take you to the login screen where you can enter your email address and password. UserID's are no longer used; they have been replaced with your email address. If you have forgotten your password, click on the link "Forgot Password" and enter your email address. Instructions will be sent to you to reset your password. Once you log into your account, your upcoming gifts and transaction history will appear. If you wish to change an upcoming gift, click on the three dots next to the dollar amount. You will have the option to "edit", "pause gift" or "cancel gift". Follow the prompts to complete any of these tasks. The system is user friendly.
