



FAITH AND JUSTICE

***Register to Vote To Protect Democracy
Deadline to Register to Vote is Wednesday, October 12***

*Let each of you look not only to his own interests,
but also to the interests of others. Philippians 2:4*

Are you registered to vote? If not, why not? These are questions that should cause us to pause and take time to consider our priorities. In order to safeguard our democracy, we must participate. Our Catholic faith and Pope Francis In his encyclical *Fratelli Tutti* urge Catholics and all people of good will to seek “a better kind of politics, one truly at the service of the common good” (No. 154).

Don't take democracy for granted. It can only survive when citizens use their vote to ensure its continuation. Past history shows us that democracies can and will die when the citizens cease to use their vote to elect representatives who will strengthen their founding values.

Each of us Catholics has a role to play in ensuring that our systems reflect a commitment to human dignity. The political process is not reserved solely for those who hold office or official positions. We have a responsibility to care for each other not just in words and thoughts, but in action. Working together towards that end means being engaged in the political process in ways that reflect those values.

What better way to engage in the political process than voting! We put our Gospel call to love one another into action by advocating for policies that support the flourishing of all people and by voting for legislators and legislation that supports these tenets.






A Woman is No Man by Etaf Rum

"Where I come from, we've learned to silence ourselves. We've been taught that silence will save us. Where I come from, we keep these stories to ourselves. To tell them to the outside world is unheard of—dangerous, the ultimate shame."

Palestine, 1990. Seventeen-year-old Isra prefers reading books to entertaining the suitors her father has chosen for her. Over the course of a week, the naïve and dreamy girl finds herself quickly betrothed and married, and is soon living in Brooklyn. There Isra struggles to adapt to the expectations of her oppressive mother-in-law Fareeda and strange new husband Adam, a pressure that intensifies as she begins to have children—four daughters instead of the sons Fareeda tells Isra she must bear.

Brooklyn, 2008. Eighteen-year-old Deya, Isra’s oldest daughter, must meet with potential husbands at her grandmother Fareeda’s insistence, though her only desire is to go to college. Deya can’t help but wonder if her options would have been different had her parents survived the car crash that killed them when Deya was only eight. But her grandmother is firm on the matter: the only way to secure a worthy future for Deya is through marriage to the right man.

But fate has a will of its own, and soon Deya will find herself on an unexpected path that leads her to shocking truths about her family—knowledge that will force her to question everything she thought she knew about her parents, the past, and her own future.


Dynamic Catholic Gratitude



ONLINE GIVING PLATFORM INSTRUCTIONS:

At the end of 2020 our Online Giving provider implemented a new platform. Everything rolled over from the previous site and no changes were required of you, but the site now looks and acts a little different. You can access the new Online Giving site directly by going to: <https://www.osvhub.com/sclparish/funds> or by accessing the site through St. Catherine Laboure's website, www.sclparish.org, then clicking on the Online Giving Box with the green medallion and cross picture in it. This will bring you to the main screen with the Online Giving Funds listed.

If you do not wish to create an account and want to just make a quick-give gift, you can click on the "Give Now" button underneath the name of the fund you wish to donate to. A new screen will appear in order to configure the gift. After you enter the gift amount, gift type and date, you will click on continue. **IMPORTANT:** The default gift type is "recurring", so if you only want a one-time gift, click on the drop down arrow next to the word recurring and select one-time. A new screen will appear requesting your personal and payment information. At the bottom of the screen, you can "Create an Account" or "Give Gift as a Guest".

If you are already an Online Giving User, you will click on "Sign In/Create an Account" in the purple bar on the top right hand side of the screen. This will take you to the login screen where you can enter your email address and password. UserID's are no longer used; they have been replaced with your email address. If you have forgotten your password, click on the link "Forgot Password" and enter your email address. Instructions will be sent to you to reset your password. Once you log into your account, your upcoming gifts and transaction history will appear. If you wish to change an upcoming gift, click on the three dots next to the dollar amount. You will have the option to "edit", "pause gift" or "cancel gift". Follow the prompts to complete any of these tasks. The system is user friendly.
