


An Advent Challenge: Jesus Was A Refugee

"An angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, 'Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you; for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him.'
 (Matthew 2:14)



Advent themes of hope, peace, love, and joy surround the altar during Advent. Soon after His birth, violence drove Jesus from his birthplace and forced Him to seek shelter in a foreign land (Egypt) as many refugees from Haiti and Venezuela flee to our country now. Do our conversations reflect hope, peace, joy, and love for these victims of violence?

Americans are not anti-immigrant or anti-refugee but believe in the rule of law. Actually, our current laws do not protect many who seek refuge. The laws fail to acknowledge that many entering our country need a safe haven for their families: they are forced either to leave their homeland or to face death from violent gangs like Jesus.



The Catholic immigration and refugee debate demands a framework of respect for the human person and a discussion of laws that will protect and support lives. Immigration reform can take into account both our citizens' needs and the dignity of those who are forced to leave their home to survive. *The wolf shall be a guest of the lamb. The leopard shall lie down with the kid. The calf and the young lion shall browse together with a little child to guide them.* (Isaiah 11:6)

In his message for the 2014 World Day of Migrants and Refugees, Pope Francis urged Catholics to see every human being as a child of God. *"He or she bears the image of Christ! We ourselves need to see, and then to enable others to see, that migrants and refugees do not only represent a problem to be solved, but are brothers and sisters to be welcomed, respected, and loved."*

In discussions about immigration/refugees/migrants with our families, in our workplaces and among our friends, can we use the lens of our Catholic faith, Scripture, and Catholic social teaching to frame our discussions rather than the perspective of a political party?

**Can I see that Jesus too was a refugee?
 How will I use the Advent topics of hope, peace, joy, and love in conversations
 about those struggling to flee violence for safety?**




Society of St. Vincent de Paul

In today's Gospel Jesus tells us that the good news can be seen, touched, felt and heard through the lives of God's people. We are now charged to take up the ministry of Jesus's, but we can't just ask people to take our word for it; our actions must speak for us.

Since Christmas is a time of love and gift giving, please share in Jesus ministry by giving a gift to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul so that those who are poor can know the good news of Jesus.

Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas, first appeared to Cuauhtlatzin (Juan Diego) on December 9, 1531 while he was on his way to a Eucharistic celebration in Tlatelolco, Mexico. The Virgin addressed him by his indigenous name, asking him to go to the palace of Archbishop Zumárraga to request that a shrine be erected there at the site of the apparition, in Tepeyac, so as to share her love and compassion for all believers. Juan Diego did so, but the archbishop did not believe him, demanding proof of his story and of the Lady's identity. He returned to Our Lady daily, and on December 12, he conveyed to her the archbishop's request for proof. She showed him Castilian roses blooming there through the stony ground despite the winter's cold. He picked the flowers and carried them in his tilma (mantle) to the archbishop. When he unfolded his tilma to present the roses, Mary's image was imprinted on the mantle! Her blue sash and the flower over her womb were traditional Aztec symbols of pregnancy and new life. But her features were those of a mestiza, indicating mixed Aztec-European heritage. Thus **Our Lady of Guadalupe remains the enduring icon of unity-in-diversity, the fruit of our one baptism into Jesus, her Son.** Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.

ONLINE GIVING PLATFORM INSTRUCTIONS:

At the end of 2020 our Online Giving provider implemented a new platform. Everything rolled over from the previous site and no changes were required of you, but the site now looks and acts a little different. You can access the new Online Giving site directly by going to: <https://www.osvhub.com/sclparish/funds> or by accessing the site through St. Catherine Laboure's website, www.sclparish.org, then clicking on the Online Giving Box with the green medallion and cross picture in it. This will bring you to the main screen with the Online Giving Funds listed.

If you do not wish to create an account and want to just make a quick-give gift, you can click on the "Give Now" button underneath the name of the fund you wish to donate to. A new screen will appear in order to configure the gift. After you enter the gift amount, gift type and date, you will click on continue. **IMPORTANT:** The default gift type is "recurring", so if you only want a one-time gift, click on the drop down arrow next to the word recurring and select one-time. A new screen will appear requesting your personal and payment information. At the bottom of the screen, you can "Create an Account" or "Give Gift as a Guest".

If you are already an Online Giving User, you will click on "Sign In/Create an Account" in the purple bar on the top right hand side of the screen. This will take you to the login screen where you can enter your email address and password. UserID's are no longer used; they have been replaced with your email address. If you have forgotten your password, click on the link "Forgot Password" and enter your email address. Instructions will be sent to you to reset your password. Once you log into your account, your upcoming gifts and transaction history will appear. If you wish to change an upcoming gift, click on the three dots next to the dollar amount. You will have the option to "edit", "pause gift" or "cancel gift". Follow the prompts to complete any of these tasks. The system is user friendly.
